For 2022, United Way is celebrating our second year of 211 operating as a nation-wide service from coast to coast to coast, where dialing 2-1-1 will connect any Canadian with the supports they need through free, confidential service 24/7 in over 150 languages.

We are encouraging Manitoba's unions to help celebrate and raise awareness for 211 by participating in this year's campaign and promoting 211 throughout the year. You can help by:
